BRIEFNOTE

SIR CRR COLLEGE FOR WOMEN organized breast feeding awareness program at Cheepuru Gudem village, Krishna District, Andhra Pradesh. This program was being hosted by Dr.Mounica, According to W.H.O study malnutrition causes one in every three infant deaths in India. Future 66% of the infant deaths occurs during the first year of the life. This is often caused by inappropriate feeding practice .Breast milk contains nutrients that are vital for the infant in the first few months and hence breast feeding very crucial in the initial six months, which should accompany regular food up to two years. Breast milk protects new borns from infections, helps to develop immunity and is beneficial for digestion and optimal growth, and breast feeding has been found to improve the closeness of mother and baby while direct physical contact with the mother contributes to a sense of security and later psychological development of a child.

Report of the Activity:

An awareness programme was conducted at Cheepuru Gudem village, Krishna District, Andhra Pradesh, as a part of this programme to educate the women and importance of Breast milk. Breastfeeding is the natural process of feeding an infant with breast milk directly from the mother's breast.

Dr. Mounica, Computer lecturer M. Divyasri and commerce lecturer P. Praveen and students were participated in this awareness programme.

Dr. Mounika Breast milk contains nutrients that are vital for the infant in the first few months and hence breast feeding very crucial in the initial six months, which should accompany regular food up to two years

P. Praveen said to Breast feeding provides several essential health benefits for both the mother and the child. For the infant, it helps in developing a stronger immune system, reducing the risk of infections, allergies, and certain chronic diseases. Breast milk also contains antibodies that protect infants from various illnesses. Additionally, breastfeeding is believed to promote a stronger bond between the mother and the child.

M. Divya sri said to breastfeeding helps in reducing the risk of certain types of cancer, including breast and ovarian cancer. It also aids in postpartum weight loss and assists in the contraction of the uterus, helping the mother's body return to its pre-pregnancy state.

OUTCOMES:

- Breast feeding can help protect babies against some short-term and long-term illnesses and diseases.
- Breast milk shares antibodies from the mother with her baby.
- Breast milk is the best source of nutrition for most babies.
